The restful half-mile long walking trail takes



you through an arboretum with a collection of rare and native trees. On the way, you pass seven museum quality signs that narrate and illustrate facts about


the Christian religion and its history particularly in Kentucky. The stories of thirty famous Kentuckians like Abraham Lincoln, Elisha Green, Harland Sanders, Effie Waller Smith, Mary Britton, Peggy Taylor and Dottie Rambo are spread out along the trail. Search for clues to learn about their lives and how they gave credit to their Christian faith for their achievements. To

make this experience even more fun, you can buy trading cards featuring each of these people at our shop. Collect them all.
